

# RING SIZING CHART

## INSTRUCTIONS

You can measure your ring size in a number of ways. UK sizing is measured alphabetically, in Europe and in the US it is done numerically. The most accurate way of measuring your ring size is by going to a jewellery store.

The below is a chart to help you measure your ring size at home.

## SOME TOP TIPS:

- If you are in between size, we suggest sizing up.
- Please take note that if you have larger knuckles, we would recommend going up half size
  - Bands and rings over 5mm in width may fit your finger more tightly than rings of the same size in narrower widths so you might want to consider going up in size; contact us if you're unsure.
